

Maple Leaf Table-Topper

In this class, you will begin by piecing the 12" Maple Leaf Block and then piece the smaller 6" maple leaves. Add borders and you have a quilted piece can be a table-topper or a wall-hanging.

You may decide to be more creative and add more borders and/or blocks. Or you may want to create the piece using 12" blocks only. If that is the case, plan your fabric accordingly.

The fabric quantities given on the supply list are based on the sample piece.

Fabric:

The following fabric will be needed following the colors in the sample:

Leaf fabric: Fat Quarter

Background: Fat Quarter

Orange sashing: $\frac{1}{2}$ yd

Dark green border: $\frac{1}{2}$ yd

Light green borders: $\frac{1}{2}$ yd

Other supplies:

Fabric marker

Rotary cutter, ruler (24x6 is always good) and mat

Thread for piecing

Pins

$\frac{1}{4}$ " piecing foot is helpful

sewing machine

80/12 needle for your machine

Fabric marker

Supplies for finishing: 34" square of batting and 34" square of backing fabric, cotton quilting thread, basting pins

BEFORE COMING TO CLASS—CUT THE FOLLOWING FABRIC

For the 12" Block:

From the leaf fabric, cut a $4\frac{1}{2}$ " wide strip across the width of the fat quarter. From that strip, cut a $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and one strip $4\frac{1}{2}$ " X $8\frac{1}{2}$ "

For the stem, cut a strip $1\frac{1}{2}$ " X 7 "

From the background fabric, cut two $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strips across the width of the fat quarter.
